suicide cannot be read as simply another novel it is in a sense the author s own oblique public suicide note a unique meditation on this most extreme of refusals presenting itself as an investigation into the suicide of a close friend perhaps real perhaps fictional more than twenty years earlier levé gives us little by little a striking portrait of a man with all his talents and flaws who chose to reject his life and all the people who loved him in favor of oblivion gradually through levé

s casually obsessive pointillist beautiful ruminations we come to know a stoic sensible thoughtful man who bears more than a slight psychological resemblance to levé himself but suicide is more than just a compendium of memories of an old friend it is a near exhaustive catalog of the ramifications and effects of the act of suicide and a unique and melancholy farewell to life

nominated for the chicago review of books award a work of unflinching honesty autoportrait is a hypnotic memoir of reflection loss and everyday joy from one of america s best contemporary novelists jesse ball has produced fourteen acclaimed works of deeply empathetic absurdism in poetry and fiction now he offers readers his first memoir one that showcases his humane curiosity james wood and invites the reader into a raw and personal account of love grief and memory inspired by the memoir Édouard levé put to paper shortly before his death autoportrait is an extraordinarily frank and intimate work from one of america s most brilliant authors the subtle power of ball s voice conjures the richness of everyday life on each page half remembered moments are woven together with the joys and triumphs and the mistakes and humiliations too that somehow tell us who we are why we are here held at the same height as tragic accounts of illness or death are moments of startling beauty banality or humor i wake in the morning i sit i walk long distances if there is somewhere to swim i may swim if i have a bicycle i will ride it especially to meet someone there is no more preparing for me to do other than preparing for death and i do that by laughing not laughing at death of course laughing at myself an extraordinary memoir that reminds us what is possible and builds to the kind of power one might feel reading anne carson s glass essay or joe brainard s i remember autoportrait will leave you feeling utterly invigorated inspired and a little afraid

i had a real romance with this book miranda july a highly anticipated collection from the writer maggie nelson has called bracingly good refreshing and welcome that explores the myriad ways in which desire and commodification intersect from graffiti gangs and grand theft auto to sugar daddies schopenhauer and a deadly game of russian roulette in these essays chelsea hodson probes her own desires to examine where the physical and the proprietary collide she asks what our privacy our intimacy and our own bodies are worth in the increasingly digital world of liking linking and sharing starting with hodson s own work experience which ranges from the mundane to the bizarre including modeling and working on a nasa mars mission hodson expands outward looking at the ways in which the human will submits whether in the marketplace or in a relationship both tender and jarring this collection is relevant to anyone who s ever searched for what the self is worth hodson s accumulation within each piece is purposeful and her prose vivid clear and sometimes even shocking as she explores the wonderful and strange forms of desire tonight i m someone else is a fresh poetic debut from an exciting emerging voice in which hodson asks how much can a body endure and the resounding answer almost everything

new york times bestselling and goncourt prize winning author of the anomaly any man or woman who wants to hear nothing or no more about love should put this book down anna and louise could be sisters but they don t know each other they are both married with children and for the most part they are happy on almost the same day anna a psychiatrist crosses paths with yves a writer while louise a lawyer meets anna s analyst thomas love at first sight is still possible for those into their forties and long married but when you have already mapped

out a life path a passionate affair can come at a high price for our four characters their lives are unexpectedly turned upside down by the deliciously inconvenient arrival of love for anna meeting yves has brought a flurry of excitement to her life and made her question her values her reliable husband and her responsibilities to her children for louise a successful career woman in a stable and comfortable marriage her routine is uprooted by the youthful passion she feels for thomas thought provoking sophisticated and above all amusing enough about love captures the euphoria of desire through tender and unflinching portraits of husbands wives and lovers

in his second novel newspaper the acclaimed writer photographer and artist edouard levé made perhaps his most radical attempt to remove himself from his own work made up of fictionalized newspaper articles arranged according to broad sections some familiar some not newspaper gives us a tour of the modern world as reported by its supposedly impartial chroniclers much of this news is quite sad some is funny but the whole serves as a gory parody of the way we have been taught to see our lives and the lives of our fellow human beings

a rainmaker translation grant winner from the black mountain institute senselessness acclaimed salvadoran author horacio castallanos moya s astounding debut in english explores horror with hilarity and electrifying panache a boozing sex obsessed writer finds himself employed by the catholic church an institution he loathes to proofread a 1 100 page report on the army s massacre and torture of thousands of indigenous villagers a decade earlier including the testimonies of the survivors the writer s job is to tidy it up he rants that was what my work was all about cleaning up and giving a manicure to the catholic hands that were piously getting ready to squeeze the balls of the military tiger mesmerized by the strange vallejo like poetry of the indians phrases the houses they were sad because no people were inside them the increasingly agitated and frightened writer is endangered twice over by the spell the strangely beautiful heart rending voices exert over his tenuous sanity and by real danger after all the murderers are the very generals who still run this unnamed latin american country

the poignant and fascinating story of a young man who is caught between the breakup of the traditions of a northern japanese aristocratic family and the impact of western ideas mine has been a life of much shame i can t even guess myself what it must be to live the life of a human being portraying himself as a failure the protagonist of osamu dazai s no longer human narrates a seemingly normal life even while he feels himself incapable of understanding human beings his attempts to reconcile himself to the world around him begin in early childhood continue through high school where he becomes a clown to mask his alienation and eventually lead to a failed suicide attempt as an adult without sentimentality he records the casual cruelties of life and its fleeting moments of human connection and tenderness still one of the ten bestselling books in japan no longer human is an important and unforgettable modern classic the struggle of the individual to fit into a normalizing society remains just as relevant today as it was at the time of writing the japan times

what is this village why is he here and who is hilda a fascinating novel of love illness despair and betrayal a cure for suicide is the most captivating novel yet from this audacious and original writer jesse ball is the author of four other novels samedi the deafness the way through doors the curfew and silence once begun he was a finalist for the 2015 new york public library young lions fiction award and a 2014 los angeles times book prize ball received an nea creative writing fellowship for 2014 and the 2008 paris review plimpton prize his verse has been included in the best american poetry series he gives classes on lucid dreaming and lying at the school of the art institute of chicago this dystopian novel from ball is both a puzzle box and a haunting love story whatever the source of this book s elusive magic it should cement ball s reputation as a technical innovator whose work delivers a powerful emotional impact starred review publishers weekly a poet by trade ball understands the economy of language better than most fiction writers today huffington post with the simplicity of a fable and the drama of a psychological thriller ball tells a story about starting over from nothing reconstructing life from its most basic elements at each unforeseeable turn a cure for suicide is a story ball ensures we understand and because it is subtle and breathtaking we are happy to be told new york times fans of eerie dystopian settings à la never let me go will love this read elle a cure for suicide is a novel that is simultaneously powerful and elusive whose dreamlike textures and sense of dislocation lend its reflection of our own fears genuine power suggesting not just unsettling questions about our own unease about suffering but also probing the uncertain intersection of fiction and reality memory and imagination australian as in his previous novel silence once begun ball s prose is careful and elegant with moments of freeze dried lyricism beyond the narrative games it achieves a beauty of a kind pathos even it repays a second reading age sydney morning herald a strange and beautiful tale i am already looking forward to rereading it otago daily times

x a young midwestern novelist of uncertain talent attends a chicago based writing program and relapses after a few years of relative celexa fueled relief from depression and self harm though his world grows dark and cold and he moves away from society with the unerring sincerity of the pilgrim we never lose faith in x due to maierhofer s impressive storytelling he s good both at the level of detail and sentence and in the larger picture and for what might still be called plot even in a novel so postmodern and affectless postures establishes

itself early on as a guide to young america but if i d read the french translation i would be thinking of baudelaire his poetry and fury and contempt and his sadness and his call for a transfixing fire kevin killian author of spreadeagle part beckett part unabomber manifesto part laurie weeks grant maierhofer s flamingos is singularly alive and wild maggie nelsona dauntingly prolific and daring writer grant maierhofer tears his way through the terra firma of received language to roiling realms that writers rarely reach bleach will seep into your brainpan and give it the stinging deep cleanse you know it needs gari lutz

this reprinting of korine s first novel presents fragments of a portrait in multimedia print photographs drawings news clippings handwriting a poem attempted diagrams clip art but mostly text including hard luck stories off and on colour jokes script scraps found letters free rhymes drug flashbacks and other scenes exploring the world of show biz with feet set lightly in the black humours of the real ol world this excretion of the dangles of public life would make william burroughs sigh and turn the page at least

this book is not a suicide note ten days after edouard leve handed in the manuscript of suicide to his publisher in 2007 he hanged himself in his apartment he was 42 two years after jean amery s on suicide was published in 1976 the author took an overdose of sleeping pills he was 65 in 1960 some eighteen years after albert camus had raised and so he thought resolved the question of suicide in the myth of sisyphus he was killed in a car accident he is alleged to have said that dying in a car crash is the most absurd of all deaths the absurdity of his death is compounded by the fact he had an unused train ticket in his pocket he was 46 let me say at the outset at the risk of disappointing the reader that i have no plans to kill myself just yet nor do i wish to join the chorus of those who proclaim loudly against suicide and claim that the act of taking one s own life is irresponsible and selfish even shameful and cowardly that people must stay alive whatever the cost suicide in my view is neither a legal nor moral offence and should not be seen as such my intention here is to simply try to understand the phenomenon the act itself what precedes it and what follows i d like to consider suicide from the point of view of those who have made the leap or have come close to it we might even find that the capacity to take that leap is what picks us out as humans i want to look at suicide closely carefully and perhaps a little coldly without immediately leaping to judgements or asserting moral principles like the right to life or death we have to look suicide in the face long and hard and see what features what profile what inherited character traits and wrinkles emerge perhaps what we see when we look closely is our own distorted reflection staring back at us

from a new york times bestselling author egyptologist amelia peabody now a wife and mother returns to catch a murderer at an excavation of an ancient tomb it s 1892 and amelia and her now husband radcliffe emerson have settled down in victorian england after their escapade in egypt they re raising their young son ramses and everything seems normal until they are approached by a damsel in distress lady baskerville s husband sir henry has died after uncovering what might be a royal tomb in luxor despite rumors of a curse haunting all those involved with the dig amelia and radcliffe proceed to egypt and realize that sir henry did not die a natural death accidents continue to plague the dig and talk of a pharaoh s curse runs rampant among the group amelia begins to suspect that these accidents are caused by a sinister human but who

scrounged from his notebooks and hearsay this is the story of a schoolteacher named konrad zündel a philosopher a wanna be writer scattered self conscious glum anxious unlucky discontent at the end of his rope he decides to flee his workaday life at all costs only to find escape always a little beyond his reach first his tooth falls out in the sight of other travelers then he finds a severed finger in a restroom on a train in fact zündel seems on the verge of falling to bits as do his words thoughts wife and world will there be anything left and anyone to hold the pieces zündel s exit is a chaplinesque comedy of disintegration never knowing if it s coming or going

a memoir in the form of a series of sharply etched vignettes that shift astonishingly in time and mood and range in place from africa and the us to the streets of london it demonstrates that no moment is isolated and that privilege conflict race and gender are inherent in all our encounters from the banal to the extreme

now in paperback a bewitching collection of stories and novellas that are suspenseful thought provoking mystical and haunting publishers weekly ranging from the seventeenth century to the present and crossing multiple continents counternarratives draws upon memoirs newspaper accounts detective stories and interrogation transcripts to create new and strange perspectives on our past and present an outtake chronicles an escaped slave s take on liberty and the american revolution the strange history of our lady of the sorrows presents a bizarre series of events that unfold in haiti and a nineteenth century kentucky convent the aeronauts soars between bustling philadelphia still rustic washington and the theater of the u s civil war rivers portrays a free jim meeting up decades later with his former raftmate huckleberry finn and in acrobatique the subject of a famous edgar degas painting talks back

published to accompany the 1994 exhibition at the museum of modern art new york this book constitutes the most extensive survey of modern illustrated books to be offered in many years work by artists from pierre bonnard to barbara kruger and writers from guillaume apollinaire to susan sontag an important reference for collectors and connoisseurs includes notable works by marc chagall henri matisse and pablo picasso

debut novelist miles klee takes a landscape of drugs decay loss and perhaps hope and manages to make the ensemble wryly funny something only a few notable contemporaries such as jeff vandermeer and michael chabon have been able to do post urban new jersey is instantly recognizable in this interlinked series of short vignettes and lev s living room is puddles of water and sun and a bunch of those furry caterpillars are hauling themselves from surface to surface populated by a bumbling murderous citizenry of corrupt cops innocents ravenous addicts lovesick geniuses and cynical adventurers ivyland operates in the shadow of a giant pharmaceutical corporation that thrives on people s weaknesses and may have an even more sinister agenda it s our world only a bit more extreme and lovingly precisely depicted with the adept skills native to a master of dark humor

william and molly lead a life of small pleasures riddles at the kitchen table and games of string and orange peels all around them a city rages with war when the uprising began william s wife was taken leaving him alone with their young daughter they keep their heads down and try to remain unnoticed as police

patrol the streets enforcing a curfew and arresting citizens but when an old friend seeks william out claiming to know what happened to his wife william must risk everything he ventures out after dark and young molly is left to play reconstructing his dangerous voyage his past and their future an astounding portrait of fierce love within a world of random violence the curfew is a mesmerizing feat of literary imagination

rare edition with unique illustrations this is the story of an underwater tour of the world and is a classic science fiction novel by french writer jules verne published in 1870 it tells the story of captain nemo and his submarine nautilus as seen from the perspective of professor pierre aronnax after he his servant conseil and canadian whaler ned land wash up on their ship on the nautilus the three embark on a journey which has them going all around the world the book was highly acclaimed when released and still is now it is regarded as one of the premiere adventure novels and one of verne s greatest works along with around the world in eighty days and journey to the center of the earth

a surprisingly maximalist portrait of a life new york times book review the 52 micro memoirs in genre defying heating cooling offer bright glimpses into a richly lived life combining the compression of poetry with the truth telling of nonfiction into one heartfelt celebratory book alternately wistful and wry ranging from childhood recollections to quirky cultural observations these micro memoirs build on one another to shape a life from unexpectedly illuminating moments

a notable discovery of a truly original voice several stories inhabit roger lewinter s first small book to appear in english story of love in solitude each story takes the form of a loop a spider who won t stop returning camellias that flourish and then die dying parents whose presence is always yet felt turning again and again to work on rilke translations a younger man whom the narrator sees each week at the geneva street markets all the tales touch on the possibility the open possibility of love a loop without end lewinter s short fictional works are at once prose poems and a form of dreaming they are akin to the great french tradition of things sparking emotions and emotions sparking things part sarraute part robbe grillet part percec plot is not really the point of his meditative works lewinter concerns himself more with perception apperception and sudden inflections of grace loss and beauty meet in an explosion of joy which becomes in its brilliance a means of transmittal

this book will help the reader to understand the suicidal mind from a phenomenological point of view shedding light on the feelings of suicidal individuals and also those of clinicians in accordance with the importance that the phenomenological approach attaches to subjectivity and sense of self as the starting points for knowledge emphasis is placed on the need for the clinician to focus on the subjective experiences of the at risk individual to set aside prior assumptions judgments or interpretations and to identify ways of bridging gaps in communication associated with negative emotions the vital importance of empathy is stressed drawing attention to the insights offered by neuroimaging studies and the role of mirror neurons in social cognition it is widely acknowledged that when a clinician meets a person who wants to die by suicide the clinician does not fully understand what is going on inside the mind of that individual this book recognizes that any approach to suicide prevention must promote understanding of suicidal thoughts and feelings the awareness that it

fosters and the innovative perspectives that it presents will appeal to a wide readership

at 16 edie knew things then she discovered what it was to fall in love she dared to let herself be happy but in one moment of tragedy her dreams were torn apart 20 years on edie is brought together with her sister again and the truth of what happened years ago may finally become clear

eliza travels to sydney to deal with the estate of her aunt dodge and finds maxine a hitherto unknown cousin occupying dodge s apartment when legal complications derail plans to live it up on their inheritance the women s lives become consumed by absurd attempts to deal with australian tax law as well their own mounting boredom and squalor the most astonishing debut novel of the decade dodge rose calls to mind henry green in its skewed use of colloquial speech joyce in its love of inventories and william gaddis in its virtuoso lampooning of law high finance and national myth provided by publisher

startlingly audacious literary review new writing from the literary master throughout proust s life nine of his short stories remained unseen the writer never even spoke of them perhaps he was not ready to share the early themes he was nurturing for his masterpiece in search of lost time or perhaps in dealing directly with gay desire they were too audacious too near to life for the censorious society of the time in these stories published in english for the first time we find an intimate portrait of a young author full of darkness complexity and melancholy longing to reveal himself to the world

this book is an anthology with a difference it presents a distinctive variety of anglo norman works beginning in the twelfth century and ending in the nineteenth covering a broad range of genres and writers introduced in a lively and thought provoking way facing page translations into accessible and engaging modern english are provided throughout bringing these texts to life for a contemporary audience the collection offers a selection of fascinating passages and whole texts many of which are not anthologised or translated anywhere else it explores little known byways of arthurian legend and stories of real life crime and punishment women s voices tell history write letters berate pagans advice is offered on how to win friends and influence people how to cure people s ailments and how to keep clear of the law and stories from the bible are retold with commentary together with guidance on prayer and confession each text is introduced and elucidated with notes and full references and the material is divided into three main sections story a variety of narrative forms miscellany including letters law and medicine and other non fiction and religious saints lives sermons bible commentary and prayers passages in one genre have been chosen so as to reflect themes or stories that appear in another so that the book can be enjoyed as a collection or used as a resource to dip into for selected texts this anthology is essential reading for students and scholars of anglo norman and medieval literature and culture wide ranging and fully referenced it can be used as a springboard for further study or relished in its own right by readers interested to discover anglo norman literature that was written to amuse instruct entertain or admonish medieval audiences
