acclaimed historian gerald horne troubles america s settler colonialism s creation myth august 2019 saw numerous commemorations of the year 1619 when what was said to be the first arrival of enslaved africans occurred in north america yet in the 1520s the spanish from their imperial perch in santo domingo had already brought enslaved africans to what was to become south carolina the enslaved people here quickly defected to local indigenous populations and compelled their captors to flee deploying such illuminating research the dawning of the apocalypse is a riveting revision of the creation myth of settler colonialism and how the united states was formed here gerald horne argues forcefully that in order to understand the arrival of colonists from the british isles in the early seventeenth century one must first understand the long sixteenth century from 1492 until the arrival of settlers in virginia in 1607 during this prolonged century horne contends whiteness morphed into white supremacy and allowed england to co opt not only religious minorities but also various nationalities throughout europe thus forging a muscular bloc that was needed to confront rambunctious indigenes and africans in retelling the bloodthirsty story of the invasion of the americas horne recounts how the fierce resistance by africans and their indigenous allies weakened spain and enabled london to dispatch settlers to virginia in 1607 these settlers laid the groundwork for the british empire and its revolting spawn that became the united states of america

the exposition of the apocalypse by tyconius of carthage fl 380 was pivotal in the history of interpretation of the book of revelation while expositors of the second and third centuries viewed the apocalypse of john or book of revelation as mainly about the time of antichrist and the end of the world in the late fourth century tyconius interpreted john s visions as figurative of the struggles facing the church throughout the entire period between the incarnation and the second coming of christ tyconius s ecclesiastical reading of the apocalypse was highly regarded by early medieval commentators like caesarius of arles primasius of hadrumetum bede and beatus of liebana who often quoted from tyconius s exposition in their own apocalypse commentaries unfortunately no complete manuscript of the exposition by tyconius has survived a number of recent scholars however believed that a large portion of his exposition could be reconstructed from citations of it in the aforementioned early medieval writers and this task was undertaken by monsignor roger gryson gryson s edition a reconstruction of the expositio apocalypseos of tyconius was published in 2011 in corpus christianorum series latina the present translation of that reconstructed text with introduction and notes exhibits tyconius s unique non apocalyptic approach to the book of revelation it also shows that throughout the exposition tyconius made use of interpretive rules that he had laid out in an earlier work on hermeneutics the book of rules strongly suggesting that tyconius wrote his exposition as a companion to his book of rules thus the exposition served as an exemplar of how those rules would apply to interpretation of even the most intriguing of biblical texts the apocalypse

we inhabit a time of crisis totalitarianism environmental collapse and the unquestioned rule of neoliberal capitalism philosopher jean vioulac is invested in and worried by all of this but his main concern lies with how these phenomena all represent a crisis within and a threat to thinking itself in his first book to be translated into english vioulac radicalizes heidegger s understanding of truth as disclosure through the notion of truth as apocalypse this apocalypse of truth works as an unveiling that reveals both the finitude and mystery of truth allowing a full confrontation with truth as absence engaging with heidegger marx and st paul as well as contemporary figures including giorgio agamben alain badiou and slavoj žižek vioulac s book presents a subtle masterful exposition of his analysis before culminating in a powerful vision of the abyss of the deity here vioulac articulates a portrait of christianity as a religion of mourning

waiting for a god who has already passed by a form of ever present eschatology whose end has always already taken place with a preface by jean luc marion apocalypse of truth presents a major contemporary french thinker to english speaking audiences for the first time

acquired a negative connotation over the centuries that has taken it away from its original meaning to evoke a cataclysmic and destructive event this word has become popular for the wrong reasons in ancient greek it means a disclosure or revelation of great knowledge the first key to better understand the mysteries of the prophecies of revelation is to refer to old testament scriptures in order to understand the new testament one should ask how the people of israel understood and interpreted the teachings of jesus and the apostles in their day the second key is to consider the historical and political context of the time of writing of the text in the first century the roman empire persecuted sometimes with extreme violence the followers of jesus christ finally the third key proposed is to regard the book of revelation as a sort of synthesis a summary of eschatological prophecies present throughout the bible far from claiming to provide absolute truth these three major keys help to decipher the true meaning of the text and better grasp its allusions and other symbolisms thus history archeology and culture anchor the book in reality this unveiling gives context that speaks with great interest to our generation

how the political violence of modern jihad echoes the crises of western liberalism in this authoritative accessible study historian suzanne schneider examines the politics and ideology of the islamic state better

known as isis schneider argues that today's jihad is not the residue from a less enlightened time nor does it have much in common with its classical or medieval form but it does bear a striking resemblance to the reactionary political formations and acts of spectacular violence that are upending life in western democracies from authoritarian populism to mass shootings xenophobic nationalism and the allure of conspiratorial thinking schneider argues that modern jihad is not the antithesis to western neoliberalism but rather a dark reflection of its inner logic written with the sensibility of a political theorist and based on extensive research into a wide range of sources from islamic jurisprudence to popular recruitment videos contemporary apocalyptic literature and the islamic state's arabic language publications the book explores modern jihad as an image of a potential dark future already heralded by neoliberal modes of life surveying ideas of the state violence identity and political community schneider argues that modern jihad and neoliberalism are two versions of a politics of failure the inability to imagine a better life here on earth

in this post apocalyptic rollercoaster ride philosopher srećko horvat invites us to explore the apocalypse in terms of revelation rather than as the end itself he argues that the only way to prevent the end i.e. extinction is to engage in a close reading of various interconnected threats such as climate crisis the nuclear age and the ongoing pandemic drawing on the work of neglected philosopher g nther anders this book outlines a philosophical approach to deal with what horvat borrowing a term from climate science and giving it a theological twist calls eschatological tipping points these are no longer just the nuclear age or climate crisis but their collision conjoined with various other major threats not only pandemics but also the viruses of capitalism and fascism in his investigation of the future of places such as chernobyl the mediterranean and the marshall islands as well as many others affected by covid 19 horvat contends that the revelation appears simple and unprecedented the alternatives are no longer socialism or barbarism our only alternatives today are a radical reinvention of the world or mass extinction after the apocalypse is an urgent call not only to mourn tomorrow's dead today but to struggle for our future while we can

our fear of the world ending like our fear of the dark is ancient deep seated and perennial it crosses boundaries of space and time recurs in all human communities and finds expression in every aspect of cultural production from pre historic cave paintings to high tech computer games this volume examines historical and imaginary scenarios of apocalypse the depiction of its likely triggers and imagined landscapes in the aftermath of global destruction its discussion moves effortlessly from classic novels including aldous huxley's brave new world george orwell's nineteen eighty four and margaret atwood's oryx and crake to blockbuster films such as blade runner armageddon and invasion of the body snatchers lisboa also takes into account religious doctrine scientific research and the visual arts to create a penetrating multi disciplinary study that provides profound insight into one of western culture's most fascinating and enduring preoccupations

chronicles how american culture deeply rooted in white supremacy slavery and capitalism finds its origin story in the 17th century european colonization of africa and north america exposing the structural origins of american looting virtually no part of the modern united states the economy education constitutional law religious institutions sports literature economics even protest movements can be understood without first understanding the slavery and dispossession that laid its foundation to that end historian gerald horne digs deeply into europe s colonization of africa and the new world when from columbus s arrival until the civil war some 13 million africans and some 5 million native americans were forced to build and cultivate a society extolling liberty and justice for all the seventeenth century was according to horne an era when the roots of slavery white supremacy and capitalism became inextricably tangled into a complex history involving war and revolts in europe england s conquest of the scots and irish the development of formidable new weaponry able to ensure europe s colonial dominance the rebel merchants of north america who created these united states and the hordes of europeans whose newfound opportunities in this free land amounted to combat pay for their efforts as white settlers centering his book on the eastern seaboard of north america the caribbean africa and what is now great britain horne provides a deeply researched harrowing account of the apocalyptic loss and misery that likely has no parallel in human history the apocalypse of settler colonialism is an essential book that will not allow history to be told by the victors it is especially needed now in the age of trump for it has never been more vital horne writes to shed light on the contemporary moment wherein it appears that these malevolent forces have received a new lease on life
